We also enjoyed working outside, thinking about 'Life on land' and using the cardboard we had collected to 'frame' natural objects in different ways. This year's science work really came in handy as we were able to identify and name some of the local plants and trees. We loved the chance to be part of the 'World's Largest Lesson' and to think about the impact we might have upon our natural world.

In LKS2 we've had such a busy and enjoyable week. It began with Year 4 heading out on their residential to Tattenhall on Monday. They all had a fantastic time away taking part in activities such as zip lining and tree climbing. Whilst Year 4 were away, Year 3 made their own papyrus paper using the techniques the Egyptians would have used in ancient times. We learnt about hieroglyphs and then produced cartouches. We created our own comic freeze frames explaining Howard Carter's phenomenal discover of King Tutankhamun's tomb. We even had time to make our own strawberry smoothies in DT! On Wednesday we had an amazing time participating in 'One Adventure Day'. The children showed incredible bravery and problem solving skills when faced with the rock climbing wall, laser tag and various other team building activities. 

















UKS2

It all started when they investigated the different movements created by toys. We worked through many stages of product design such as creating a list of criteria for our final product, formulating different designs to meet the criteria, production, and lastly evaluation. CAMS mechanisms were incorporated in our moving toys and skills including sawing and measuring were utilised to create their toy. The children are rightly proud of their final products which showcase creativity and skill.




