Reception

In Reception, we have been talking about what we can do now and how we have changed since we were babies. We then looked at the text 'Peepo' and discussed activities in the pictures that would now be done in a different way. In Maths, we are learning to recognise and count different representations of numbers up to 5 and have used a five frame to help structure the counting and reasoning. We are learning to understand that even if the order or arrangement changes, the number stays the same.





The children in Year Two enjoyed a workshop in the hall on Tuesday, all about the story of Creation. Sarah from St George's church shared the story with the children and they took part in two exciting activities. They made flowers using paper cases and pipe cleaners and decorated their creations with their own ideas about how they might help the world. The children also had lots of fun making paper stars, writing on their wishes, then watching as the stars opened up when placed in water. What a lovely morning!

All of KS1 have thoroughly enjoyed their art lessons this week. They have been practising their observational skills, looking closely at shells and drawing what they could see. They also rose to the challenge of making continuous line drawings, where they were not allowed to take their pencil off the paper!







LKS2

This week the children have continued to learn about Katherine Johnson and her impact and importance during the USA and Soviet Union space race. The children have been using adjectives, prepositions, and adverbs to describe the explosion on Apollo 13. In Maths, the children have started their addition and subtraction unit and are using mental and concrete methods to solve problems. In RE, the children have been learning about symbols in Christianity and have recreated these symbols by using natural resources.















UKS2

This week, the children have enjoyed continuing to explore the fascinating world of the circulatory system. They used Cheerios to represent red blood cells, marshmallows to symbolize white blood cells, and sequins to depict platelets, all coming together to form a model of blood. The children discussed the different components of blood and what role each element plays. Ask your children if they can explain why each component was chosen.

We have also continued reading about the life of Matthew Henson as he Raced to the Frozen North. They are enjoying hearing about his adventures at sea.
