#### KS1

Happy New Year! We hope that everyone has had a lovely break and is ready for our new term. This term our topic is all about different creatures! You will receive an email with our spring newsletter which will tell you more about what your child will be learning in each subject this term.

It was lovely to welcome the children back on Tuesday and we have had a great first week. We began the week by thinking about the season of winter, the weather we are likely to see and the changes in temperatures that occur. The children enjoyed sharing what activities they like to do in winter, and it is safe to say that we will all be very excited if we do get snow! In RE we started our learning about the Jewish festival of Shabbat and thought about what we do on different days of the week.







#### LKS2

This week LKS2 have begun their new science topic, 'States of Matter'. We begun by looking at a rock, a wooden table and some water and discussing 'what is the same and what is different?'. We identified that the water is a liquid and the other two objects are solids, but we also had suggestions such as the table has been altered by humans and the others haven't, or that they are all related to water because the rock has been shaped by water and the tree needs water to grow. After that, we worked on identifying solids, liquids and gases and grouping them accordingly. We then discussed what the difference was between these different states of matter and how water and solids will always keep the same volume but gas can spread out and cover much more space.

Happy New Year to all the children and families in UKS2. We hope you had a lovely break.

This week, we have ended our Anglo-Saxon/Viking topic by learning all about their beliefs.
