Reception

In Reception, we enjoyed listening to the story 'The Kiss That Missed' by David Melling. We then focused on the images/illustrations to talk about the past and to find out information including people who lived in castles and their jobs. We worked together to make our own castle and discussed the different features such as a moat, drawbridge, turrets and battlements.









We have had a busy first week back after half term in KS1. We have begun our new P.E. units gymnastics and invasion games. In gymnastics we looked at different gymnastic positions such as pike, straddle, tuck and dish. We have been learning about attackers and defenders in invasion games. We worked collaboratively to try different skills to develop our ball control

LKS2

KS1

In science this week we were looking at water usage and the children have been looking at helping out on a space mission gone wrong. They were presented with the scenario that a spaceship had been struck by a meteor that had damaged the water tank tap. The ship has a 500 litres tank and we needed to work out how long the water supply would last with water dripping from the tap. The children came up with the idea to work out how much water had dripped out in 1 minute, and then use that to work out how much water would be lost in 1 hour, 1 day and 1 year. We worked out that the water tank would be empty in around 20 days and that in a year we would lose around 9000 litres of water from a dripping tap.











The rocket was hit by a meteor and is losing water. The pump to the tap was damaged. If this carries on they could run out of water! NASA is investigating the problem so the astronauts can fix it.

We have worked out that the amount of water that they will lose in on minute is 15ml ,therefore in an hour they will lose 900ml that means in a day they will lose 21.6 litres. In a year they will lose 7905.6 Litres in 22 days they will lose most of their water.

Artemis space leak

The NASA spaceship Artemis has been damaged by a meteor! Luckily, there panels and systems weren't harmed but there's been a leak. The crew is now in danger because they only have 500 L of water, this is a question of life and death. Will they survive?

If the leak continues for a minute it will lose 15 ml which is a problem because if it goes on for an hour it will lose 900ml. If it continues for day we will have such an impact on water storage that the amount will reduce by 21.6L which is too much wasted. In a years time we will lose 7905L!

UKS2

Welcome back! We hope everyone enjoyed their half term break.

In our science lessons this week, the children in UKS2 have been delving into the fascinating world of Charles Darwin and his theory of evolution. Exploring the concept of adaptation and natural selection, they have enjoyed learning about the wonders of how species change over time.

Inspired by Darwin's observations on the Galapagos Islands, the children conducted a hands-on investigation in class. Using a variety of tools such as chopsticks, spoons, and pegs, the children simulated the beaks of different birds. They were tasked with picking up variously sized pieces of food, including cubes, rice, and spaghetti, mimicking the challenges faced by different bird species in obtaining food in their respective environments. Not only was this activity great fun, but it also provided invaluable learning opportunities. Through experimentation and observation, the children gained a deeper understanding of how certain traits can be advantageous for survival in specific environments, thus reinforcing the concepts of adaptation and natural selection.

We were thrilled to see the enthusiasm of the children and feel confident that it has enhanced their understanding of Darwin's theory of evolution.
