We are delighted to share an update with you regarding our recent Nature Day at Lower Park School. Last Friday, as part of our ongoing commitment to the Global Goals, we organised this day to promote environmental awareness and sustainability among our children. This was an initiative that stemmed from pupil voice, when our children told us that they would like a whole day to focus on sustainability. The Global Goals, also known as the Sustainable Development Goals, are a set of 17 goals established by the United Nations to address global challenges and create a more sustainable future. By incorporating these goals into our curriculum, we aim to foster a sense of global citizenship and empower our students to become responsible and active contributors to society. The children responded with enthusiasm to the messaging around a global tick list in a special assembly and continued their learning in a range of activities throughout the day.

Reception


Our industrious Reception class had a fantastic time engaging in a task that focused on the importance of providing a safe haven for our little creepy-crawly friends. The children worked diligently to plan, design, and make individual bug hotels using recycled plastic bottles. It was a wonderful opportunity for them to understand the significance of upcycling and caring for our environment.







The budding artists in Key Stage 1 displayed their creativity by participating in an art project centred on bottle tops. They used these recycled materials to create stunning pictures, showcasing their imaginative abilities as well as highlighting the Global Goal of, 'Life on Land.' The children also enjoyed a delightful nature walk, where they had the chance to identify various plants that they had learned about during the autumn term. They then framed their favourite findings using recycled card, combining art and nature in a wonderful way.

The environmentally conscious children in Lower Key Stage 2 learned about the importance of sustainability through all sorts of exciting activities. They took part in creating seed bombs, a fun and innovative way to promote biodiversity. They also explored the concept of composting, understanding the value of reducing waste and nourishing the earth. To add a musical touch, the children crafted wind chimes using recycled materials. The day concluded with an invigorating nature walk and some cloud watching, where they could fully appreciate the beauty of the natural world.

Our older children in Upper Key Stage 2 had a hands-on experience with horticulture by making their own newspaper plant pots and sewing some cornflower seeds. The children took them home and we hope that they will continue to nurture these until they can be planted out, adding a flash of Lower Park blue to your gardens. It was an engaging and educational day that allowed our students to delve into various aspects of the science curriculum, such as cloning potatoes, taking geranium cuttings, conducting observational drawings, and labelling plants. Through hands-on activities, the

students explored the concept of asexual reproduction by cloning potatoes and gained practical skills in plant propagation. They also honed their observation and documentation techniques by creating detailed drawings and labelling different plant species.

Overall, our Nature Day event was a resounding success! The children not only had a fantastic time, but they also learned invaluable lessons about the importance of protecting and nurturing our planet. By participating in activities that align with the 17 Global Goals, we strive to empower our children to become responsible global citizens.

What can you do to help?

- · Walk or bike to school whenever possible instead of driving.
- Encourage children to pack their lunches using reusable containers and bottles to minimise packaging waste.
- Teach children about the importance of recycling and set up designated bins for different types of recyclable materials at home.
- Encourage children to participate in recycling initiatives such as collecting and sorting recyclables from around the house.
- · Teach children about composting and encourage them to compost fruit and vegetable scraps at home.
- Encourage children to turn off lights, electronics, and appliances when not in use to save energy.
- \cdot Teach children about water conservation and encourage them to turn off the tap while brushing their teeth and take shorter showers.
- Encourage children to participate in gardening and growing their own fruits, vegetables, or herbs at home.
- Teach children about the importance of reducing food waste and encourage them to only take what they can eat during meals.
- Encourage children to reuse and repurpose items at home instead of throwing them away, such as using old jars as storage containers or making crafts from recycled materials


