Curriculum this half term

English - Reading & Writing. Focused reading skills, Comprehension.

Our texts will focus on Non- Fiction Recounts (UFOs and Aliens :Investigating Extraterrestrial Visitors - Extreme! by Paul Mason and UFO Diary by Satoshi Kitamura). Fiction (Short by Kevin Crossley), Mystery and Crime Writing, Poetry (The Power of Imagery) and Journalistic Writing (Please note, depending on sets, children will work on different genres)

Maths – Number, Algebra, Geometry, Statistics, Mental Strategies and Problem Solving **Science** – Habitats, Food chains and Adaptation

History – The Ancient Egyptians. The children will gain a thorough knowledge of Pharoahs, pyramids, mythology, daily life and The Nile. If you have any resources that you think could enhance our topic, please encourage your child to bring them into school. **Art** – Linked to David Hockney's landscapes

ICT - Switched on ICT - Geotrails

French - Healthy Eating and Creating a Cafe

Music - Linked to The Ancient Egyptians

Theme Weeks

9th 13th January - We have started our **Design & Technology topic** this week, designing, constructing and evaluating a Moving Toy. This will involve investigating the way cams can influence the way a model can move. Each class has stayed with their own teacher during the week. We are currently planning an **Egyptian Worlds workshop at Manchester Museum**. This should take place during the middle of February; pupils will develop and apply their historical enquiry skills and their knowledge about ancient Egypt, focusing on one of the Museum's mummies. Further details will be sent home soon.

2nd-3rd March - Our World Book Day activities will be based around The Horrible Egyptians books. These sessions will take place on Thursday 2nd and Friday 3rd March.

The children will learn more about Egyptian food, language and art. Please could you provide your child with an empty, clean soup pot, similar to the one in the illustration, in order to make a canopic jar. On Thursday 2nd, we hope that you will encourage your child to dress in an Egyptian themed costume. A simple style outfit would be ideal, or something more elaborate would be brilliant! We are asking for £2 contribution towards resources - please complete the attached form.



DOJO

Last term, each child took home an invitation for parents to join the DOJO network. Currently we have about half of the Year 5 parents connected. If you haven't yet joined, or have misplaced your letter, please let us know. We can re-issue login details for you to sign up, see photos and get information about what is happening in class.

Planners

Children have 'Homework Planners' to record their homework and teachers will help your child to write details and dates. Please remind your child to record daily reading completed at home, and bring his/her planner to school every day. We would ask you to check planners regularly throughout the week and sign them each weekend.

PE & Games

The day for outdoor games is Friday. Please ensure your child has the correct kit, including jogging bottoms, T-shirt, long sleeved sweatshirt type top, trainers and spare socks. A carrier bag is useful to bring this often wet and dirty kit home. PE kit is needed on the same days as last term. Please could all children have a separate PE kit (not games kit) which is kept in school. In addition, we will be asking children to ensure that long hair is tied back and jewellery is removed for PE/games lessons.

Library

Year 5 children have a library session on alternate Wednesdays where they have an opportunity to borrow books to read in class and take home. Please help your child to return their books to school on their given date.

Jewellery & Nail Varnish

We have noticed many children (boys and girls) are wearing coloured bands, bracelets, necklaces and chains. Please note that these do not conform to our uniform policy, and as a result, we are asking that you do not allow your child to wear these items to school. Please ensure your child does not wear nail varnish to school.

Mobile 'Phones

Many children are bringing mobile 'phones into school, and although this is against our school policy, we appreciate that parents wish children to carry one, especially if walking unsupervised to and from school.
