


KS1

It has been another lovely week in Key Stage one, and an exciting time for those children who had their swimming session this week. There were lots of excited faces as they headed over to the pool and the swimming coaches have commented how impressed they have been with the children's confidence and enthusiasm. The children were also visited by the PCSO's during assembly. The

children were reminded about the importance of staying safe at this time of year as the longer nights begin.

In History the children looked at the differences between fire fighting in 1666 and today. They used seesaw to share what they had learnt and recorded their comparisons. The children are fully engrossed in this history topic, and it is lovely to hear them talking with confidence about their learning. We are sure they will all thoroughly enjoy our upcoming trip. Many thanks to those parents who have volunteered to accompany us.







This week in LKS2 we have emerged ourselves in our Greek History topic. We created our own electronic timelines using an app called Keynote. We sequenced the key events from Ancient Greek culture into chronological order, starting in 776 BCE with the first Olympic games and ending in 176 BCE when the Romans invaded, bringing an end to the Greek empire. The Greek theme has continued in English where we have been reading a book called Greek Myths by Jean Menzies. We have read texts about Odysseus defeating the giant Cyclops, how the seasons were created when Persephone was kidnapped by Hades and how the Orion constellation was created. The children have been working on creating characters and settings by working on descriptive phrases. In DT the children have been performing a taste test, trying out a variety of different delicious breads, olives, and cheeses.


























UKS2

A sporty week for our UKS2 department, this week! The children have had great fun in their swimming lessons and, in other PE lessons, we have started our dance unit of work based on the choreographer, Merce Cunningham, who created a style of dance that was by chance, often called 'dance by chance'. He uses random and chance methods to choreograph dance by assigning actions, dynamics and relationships and space to numbers. Unusually, he used methods such as phone numbers, birthdays and rolling a dice to create his dance. We are looking forward to seeing what the children can produce by the end of the unit.

Anti-Bullying Week 2023: Make A Noise About Bullying



(No uniforms, workwear, pillows, duvets or pieces of fabric please)


