
Reception
















LKS2

This week the children in LKS2 have been producing their final English piece, creating amazing, eyecatching information boards on the theme of the rainforest. After spending time researching facts, the children have enjoyed producing these non-fiction pieces by including headings, subheadings, diagrams, pictures, additional information boxes and even interactive quizzes. In geography we have continued learning more about how rivers can change the landscape. In the playground the children 'became' a river learning about how the river changes its speed at different parts of a meander and that this results in erosion and deposition. We picked up the sediment (bibs) when the rivers velocity increased and deposited these particles when the speed of the water diminished. It was interesting to see how the river changed it shape over time. On Tuesday we had a brilliant e safety workshop/assembly from OpenView education. LKS2 were great at interacting and giving amazing examples of how we can improve the Internet by making a change. Back in class, we discussed further how we can stay safe and happy online and created our own pledges explaining why it is important to be mindful of others.

UKS 2 enjoyed further work centred on online safety during a workshop on Tuesday, this week. This session opted for drama activities to engage the children in their learning and understanding. The workshop was carefully designed to foster discussions and engaging activities, aimed at enhancing the children's awareness of the potential risks when engaged in the digital landscape. Its overarching objective was to arm the children with the knowledge and skills necessary to navigate the online world safely.

This session complemented our ongoing efforts to educate our children about the critical importance of online safety. By consolidating their understanding and fostering the adoption of responsible practices when it comes to internet usage and social media engagement, we hope that the children feel better equipped to behave responsibly and safely when online.




























School Council
