Reception
















LKS2

For PE we have been working on our backhand tennis strokes, focussing on our technique and accuracy when hitting the ball over the net. Our Maths lessons have continued to focus on fractions with the lessons this week looking at equivalents as well as adding and subtracting.
























































Love Music Trust Ensemble Competition


