Bromcom - MCAS app



Dear Parents and Carers,

All Halliard Trust Primary schools have recently moved to a new Management Information System provided by Bromcom. As a result, we will be moving over to a new system called My Child at School (MCAS).

If you have not already signed up, please do so as soon as possible. This will be the only route to pay for dinners, approve trips, receive communications etc.

We will fully migrate all parent accounts and balances over to the new software and will confirm the date for the changeover shortly.

It is recommended you download and set up the My Child at School (MCAS) application as soon as possible to ensure a smooth transition. This will also enable the school to resolve any queries or issues before the go live date. To sign up, please download the MCAS application onto your smartphone:

- 1. Search for "My Child at School" in the Apple App Store/Google Play Store
- 2. Install the application and if you are asked, say yes to push notifications
- 3. When you launch the application, you will be asked for a school ID, please enter 15512

4. Please register with the email address and phone number you have on record with the school

What an exciting week we have had!



This week we have had a little cross over between History and Geography. In Geography, we have been looking at land use of our surrounding area but this week we compared the land use from ancient times. First we looked at a Stone Age settlement in a book called A Street in Time, and then we looked at the same area in the Iron Age and considered the differences. We looked at how forts were built to protect from rival tribes, how trees were cut down to make way for farming and how boats on the river allowed them to fish for food. This week has also been creativity week and we have looked at the book 'The Journey' by Francesca Sanna which is a story about people fleeing their homes due to war. We discussed the things that were most precious to us and what we would take if we have to leave our home.
















UKS2






It has been a fantastic week of learning, creativity, and expression. Well done, UKS2!

This week saw The Book Bus visit Lower Park. The day was a huge success, and all 278 children visited the mobile bookshop during the day. There was a large variety of books, which the children enjoyed sharing with their peers.

A huge thank you to our whole school community for supporting the event. The total sales came to £1712.00, resulting in £257 worth of new books for our school. These books will be in our school library after half term.









Creativity Week

This week, we were delighted to take part in a creativity project in collaboration with Ignite, generously funded by the Halliard Trust. The week began with **The Big Sing** at Fallibroome Academy, where our choir joined others for a fantastic celebration of music and performance, setting the tone for an inspiring week ahead.

The theme of 'Journeys' ran throughout the week, explored through a range of creative activities. Children took part in Samba workshops with Junk Percussion – Street Style Surgery, a theatre workshop with Goofus Theatre, and dance workshops inspired by the text Coming from America. KS1 explored local journeys with visits into Poynton, while both KS1 and KS2 used A River by Marc Martin as inspiration for their creative work—imagining and illustrating their own journeys through different landscapes. KS2 also explored The Journey by Francesca Sanna (Amnesty International), a moving story about a family's search for safety, which led to thoughtful discussions and creative responses in art and drama. Children also took part in Forest School, creating Journeying Sticks to represent personal and imaginative travels using natural materials.

A highlight of the week was the way teachers across the school contributed by leading creative sessions in **art, drama, dance, and music**, giving children the opportunity to work with different staff members and explore new ways of being creative.

It has been a fantastic opportunity for children to engage with the arts in different ways, and we are grateful to Ignite, the Halliard Trust, our visiting professionals, and our staff for making it all possible.



















Safer Internet Day 2025 took place on the 11th of February 2025

Due to Creativity Week, Lower Park will be focussing on Internet Safety on the 25th February where we will be having a special assembly delivered by the CCSCOs.

Safer Internet Day is the UK's biggest celebration of online safety. Each year an online issue or theme is covered that speaks about the things young people are seeing and experiencing online. Created in consultation with young people across the UK, this year Safer Internet Day focussed on the issue of scams online and for young people, how to protect themselves and others, as well as what support is available to them.

Children will consider the future of scams, and answer questions such as:

- How is changing technology like generative AI going to impact the approach of scammers?
- What role can the government and internet industry take to tackle this threat?
- And what changes would young people like to see to help protect themselves moving forward?

Love Music Trust Vocal Residential

We have received this from Cheshire East Music Hub- an invite for pupils to attend a Vocal residential with them. If it is something your child is interested in, please contact them directly via the link.

Just a quick email to remind you of the annual Love Music Trust Vocal Residential at the Stanley Head outdoor pursuit centre in Stoke-on-Trent from Friday 2nd - Sunday 4th May. The residential course is run by the LMT Vocal Team and is suitable for all students across the borough who love to sing and want to learn more about stagecraft, vocal technique, solo and ensemble singing. The cost of the whole weekend inclusive of travel, (coach from Sandbach School at 4pm on Friday 2nd May) accommodation, meals, rehearsals and outdoor adventure activities has been subsidised by the Love Music Trust and is £175.00. The course will consist of a huge variety of workshops for all attending, plus age appropriate singing sessions, including an exciting mix of warm-ups, games, songs and choral repertoire, which will be explored over the fun-packed weekend. There will be a chance to take part in an outdoor activity, such as kayaking, high ropes and archery led by the Stanley Head Team on Saturday morning. The course will culminate in a sharing concert at 2pm to family and friends back at Sandbach School on Sunday 4th May.

This practical and vibrant course is open to students from Year 5 – Year 13 and in full time education.





