Reception

The children have thoroughly enjoyed their art lesson this week, using their fine motor skills to weave a fabulous woolly sheep. They also loved learning several Easter songs during singing assembly and music lessons, including the age-old favourite 'Spring Chicken'.

KS1

This week the children have looked at the season of Spring. They were great at discussing and recognising the signs of Spring and new life that is all around us. Lots of children have spotted daffodils growing and flowers starting to bloom. In the coming weeks in RE, the children will look at The Easter Story and learn about how some Christians celebrate the Christian festival.

LKS2

This week in PE the children have been learning how to use the forehand in tennis and how to safely complete a partner balance in gymnastics. Whilst doing tennis, we looked at the correct technique before trying to start and maintain a rally with our partner.

In gymnastics, we first looked at simple balances individually, before moving on to partner balances. We discovered that we need to trust our partner and make sure we keep our muscles tensed to form a strong pose for 5 seconds.











Moving Toys

This week, UKS2 have been getting hands-on with their DT project, creating moving toys with working mechanisms inside. Using axles, cams, and handles, the children have designed and built a fantastic range of toys, each with its own unique movement. We've had everything from spinning characters to bouncing animals, and it's been brilliant to see their creativity shine. The children have shown great perseverance, problem-solving when things didn't quite go to plan and refining their designs to make sure their toys moved smoothly. A fantastic effort all around!
