We set up a number track outside, stood on a starting number and then jumped forwards to work out what number we would land on.











In PE they have been enjoying the lovely sunshine and playing different games outside. This week, the children learned how to defend. In Geography the children learned the names of all seven continents and were able to locate and stick them on a map. They loved learning the continents song too!











The children have thrown themselves into the new term with great enthusiasm! In English, they've been working hard on a creative and informative project all about the Blue Whale. Their posters are packed with fascinating facts and thoughtful insights into the challenges these gentle giants face in today's oceans. To top it off, the posters feature some truly fantastic sketches.

In science, they've been equally engaged, exploring the topic of sound. The children thoroughly enjoyed carrying out investigations to discover how sound can be muffled and how far it can travel. There's been plenty of curiosity, teamwork, and some very clever thinking along the way!

Music has been just as inspiring! The children composed their own pieces of music inspired by different personalities. As their compositions played, they confidently read aloud fascinating facts about the person behind the music. It was a powerful blend of sound and storytelling – a real showcase of creativity, expression, and confidence!











This week, our Computing lessons introduced us to an exciting new app—**Reality Composer!**During our first session, we had some fun 'Tinker Time' to explore the app and begin getting to grips with its features. Over the coming weeks, we'll be using it to create our own AR models based on the Solar System—watch this space!

In PE, we've been shifting our focus to athletics in preparation for Sports Day. We've kicked things off by developing our sprinting technique, working on explosive starts, driving our arms, and maintaining consistent strides with high knees. The children have shown great energy and determination in the sunshine!

The Educational Psychology (EP) Service is offering parent/carer drop-in sessions at Cheshire East Family Hubs, held once per half term in both the North and South localities. These informat sessions are an apportunity to discuss connerns, seek advice, and explore strategies to support your child. They are not for Local Authority processes (e.g., HCR's or placement changes) or child assessments.

- Examples of topics include:

 Concerns about speech developme
 Managing challenging behaviour
 Social skills or play difficulties
 Anxiety or school -related issues
 Preparing for adulthood

Parents/carers can book a 30-minute slot by calling their local Family Hub. Sessions will be themed based on age groups (e.g., Start for Life, Primary, Secondary/Post-1-6) to align with the Family Hub journey map. Afternoon sessions will coincide with the Little Stars stay-and-play group for children with SEN.


