Reception

We have made the most of the beautiful weather this week and enjoyed lots of different activities in our outdoor area. Inspired by our story of 'Naughty Bus', we have been digging roads, making routes for Naughty Bus to follow and role playing catching the bus.









This week in KS1 the children have been introduced to yoga in indoor PE lessons. The children learned that yoga is good for the mind and body enabling the mind to feel calm and to increase flexibility and strength. They began the lesson by pretending to be near the ocean, they thought about what animals live in the ocean, practised their breathing and pretended to blow bubbles as they breathed out. The children then made yoga poses for different animals that they thought of. Here are some of our dolphin, seal, turtle, starfish and jellyfish poses!







This week, the children have been exploring the theme of diversity in their PSHE lessons, learning to appreciate and celebrate the differences that make each person unique and how we can use our own strengths to help others. In English, they've been enjoying Tilly Mint Tales by Berlie Doherty, using the stories to spark rich discussions and imaginative responses. They've also started their new book, Journey by Aaron Becker—a beautifully illustrated, wordless picture book that invites children to interpret the story through images alone. It's been a wonderful opportunity for them to use their creativity and storytelling skills!

UKS2

This week in Upper Key Stage 2, the children have been getting stuck into our new English unit based on Pathways to Write, all about the Galápagos Islands and Charles Darwin's travels and theory of evolution.

They've really enjoyed learning about the animals Darwin discovered and how he came up with his famous ideas. We've had some great discussions about adaptation and how different species survive in their environments.

The children have been working hard and begun to create their own newspaper articles, reporting on Darwin's journey and discoveries. It's been great to see them using what they've learned in both English and science to produce clear, informative reports.

We're really proud of their efforts and can't wait to share some of their work with you soon.
