This week children in Reception have enjoyed their first lunchtime construction club. They have also made good use of our recently renovated outdoor area and taken their learning outside the classroom.









### KS1

They then wrote adjectives and key characteristics that they thought an explorer might have. In the coming weeks, the children will be learning about lots of different explorers and they will begin to understand what each explorer's achievements were.

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
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LKS2

This week in PE the children have been doing athletics. Building on from their sessions on sprinting and relay, we have now been looking at jumping and throwing. Jumping involved different techniques such as hopping, two footed jumps and leaping. Throwing has involved chest pushes with basketballs to see how far we could get the ball. In all sessions, we have been looking at improving our personal best by developing our technique as the lessons have gone on.













#### UKS2

It has been a productive week in UKS2. In Science, pupils built on their knowledge of space by exploring the solar system specifically the movement of moons in relation to planets. Did you know, Saturn is currently known to have 146 moons? We have made cross-curricular links in ICT, where they are using AR Reality Composer to create reality models that reflect their scientific understanding.


